Sherwood Cummings, professor of English emeritus at California State University, Fullerton, will speak on Mark Twain's Moveable Farm and the Evasion in Huckleberry Finn. Professor Cummings is the author of articles and reviews on Mark Twain and of the recent Mark Twain and Science: Adventures of a Mind. He appears under the auspices of the Center's Distinguished Academic Visitors series.

Stanley Brodwin, professor of English at Hofstra University, will speak on Mark Twain: The Presbyterian Connection. Professor Brodwin is the author of numerous articles on Mark Twain, many of which have been anthologized, and an executive committee member of the Mark Twain Circle of America.

David Sewell, associate professor of English at Rochester University, will speak on Mark Twain as Liar. In addition to authoring articles and reviews, he is the author of Mark Twain's Languages: Discourse, Dialogue, and Linguistic Variety.

John McLaughlin, Elmira College's Georgia Harkness Professor of Philosophy and Religion, will speak on Risking Hell in Private and Public: The Cases of Huckleberry Finn and Mario Cuomo. An award winning teacher, Professor McLaughlin is a frequent speaker on the ethical aspects of public policy.
