Wednesday, September 18, 1991 8:00 P.M. at Quarry Farm

Professor Victor Doyno of the State University of New York at Buffalo will talk about Solving and Re(-)solving the Ending of Huckleberry Finn under the auspices of the Center's Distinguished Academic Visitors program. Professor Doyno is a member of the Center's National Committee of Academic Advisors and has both spoken and taught previously here at the Center. His most recent contribution to the field is Writing Huck Finn: Mark Twain's Creative Process, University of Pennsylvania Press, 1991.

Professor Howard Baetzhold, emeritus of Butler University, will speak on The 'Autobiography of Eve': Mark Twain's First Attempt to Tell Eve's Story under the auspices of the Center's Distinguished Academic Visitors program. A renown authority on the genesis of Mark Twain's Connecticut Yankee, his principle work is Mark Twain and John Bull. Preceding his talk, Dr. Baetzhold will receive a Certificate of Appointment as the Center's first John S. Tuckey Memorial Research Fellow-in-Residence in recognition of both his scholarly achievements in the field and his vital contributions to the Center's own development.

Grace Martin will talk about That Greatly Exaggerated Rumor...Mark Twain's Death. Grace Martin teaches writing and Mark Twain to senior citizens at Niagara Community College. She also writes and frequently reads work-in-progress in the artistic forums of upstate New York.

Professor Myra Glenn of Elmira College's History faculty will talk on Love, Sex, and Death in the Victorian Marriage: The Case of Thomas K. Beecher, Olivia Day, and Julia Jones. Dr. Glenn has authored books, articles, and reviews in the field of nineteenth century American social history. She is well into a book length study of Thomas K. Beecher and has spoken previously at the Center on her work-in-progress.
