Inez Bull and Robert Wilson will perform the same piano-duo program they presented last year at Carnegie Hall in New York City, which includes a selection from the "Tom Sawyer Ballet" composed by Vladimir Padwa. Dr. Bull is the great-granddaughter of Ole Bull, the famed nineteenth century violin virtuoso greatly admired by Mark Twain. For seventeen years Dr. Bull performed as a piano-duo with Vladimir Padwa until his death in 1981. The recipient of numerous honors and awards, Dr. Bull was appointed a United States Ambassador of Good-Will by President Eisenhower and is as well a lifetime Honorary Deputy Governor of the State of Pennsylvania. Mr. Wilson is also a renowned pianist who has performed throughout the United States and abroad. Following the musical portion of the program, Dr. Bull will make a presentation of the score of the "Tom Sawyer Ballet" to the Center and comment on her great-grandfather and Mark Twain and Vladimir Padwa.
