Gretchen Sharlow speaks *In Favor of the Farm*. Ms. Sharlow is the Center's Associate Director and has conducted extensive research on Mark Twain's Elmira home circle. Her research notes have appeared or are forthcoming in the publications of the Center, the Mark Twain Project at Berkeley, the Mark Twain Journal, and the *Mark Twain Encyclopedia*.

Sanford Pinsker, Shadek Humanities Professor at Franklin and Marshall College, will talk about *Mark Twain and the Jews*. Professor Pinsker is the author of numerous books, articles, and reviews in the fields of American literature and American-Jewish literature and culture, serves on the editorial boards of a variety of literary reviews and journals, has taught abroad as a Fulbright Senior Lecturer, and is the author of a considerable body of fiction and poetry. He appears at the Center under the auspices of its Distinguished Academic Visitors series funded by the Mark Twain Foundation.

Roger Solomon, Oviatt Professor of English at Case Western Reserve University, examines *The Gothic Mark Twain: Some Thoughts about Horror in His Work*. Professor Solomon has published books, articles, and reviews in the field of Mark Twain studies, served as a consultant to the National Endowment for the Humanities, chaired the Screening Committee in American Literature of the Senior Fulbright-Hays Program, and has been the Director of Graduate English Studies at his university since 1986. A former recipient of the highly prestigious Guggenheim Fellowship, Professor Solomon appears at the Center under the auspices of its Distinguished Academic Visitors series funded by the Mark Twain Foundation.

Michael Kiskis of Empire State College/SUNY will consider 'A Complete and Purposed Jumble': *The Problem of Mark Twain's Autobiography*.
